Brief summary of the project

About Livelihood and Environment Protection

Livelihood enhancement remains the core of all our accomplishments. Livelihood and environment protection along with poverty elimination are the core issues our accomplishments in our vision path. We are operating different programmes related to livelihood to achieve the endeavor among such initiatives. In the process, we have implemented WADI program in Gharghoda block of Raigarh district in collaboration with MGNREGA and Horticulture Department Raigarh for plantations.

Programm Wadi Development (WDP)- Phase III

‘Wadi’ originated from a Gujrati word, has a vision to provide shelter and income to tribal people. A program started in the year 2011 is successfully running into three phases. JanMitram has successfully created 1,225 Wadies so far with prime support of NABARD. The notable achievement in this programme are development of barren lands into fertile lands; farmers grew only minor millets in certain patches of these lands which has resulted as their valuable assets. We trained farmers to plant the crops along with high yielding fruits varieties as main crop and vegetables are grown as intercrop.

Field Operations in Wadi Phase III

Previous year 2018-19 we had successfully created 1,225 Wadis by planting a total of 67,375 plants of Mango (*Mangifera indica*), Cashew (*Anacardium occidentale*), Guava (*Psidium guajava*) and Lime (*Citrus aurantiifolia*). We provided all kind of water source at every wadi cluster. A total no of 62 bore well, 72 rings well, 12 no of pumps etc. Plant survival rate in these year is observed about 75-92% with development of land and water resource, intercropping has become popular.

In the year 2019-20 instead of developing new Wadis we kept our focus ourselves in renovation of existing Wadis. Many silvicultural operations such as site preparation, regeneration, weed control etc. were conducted in the field area. Table shows production details of crops in the year 2018-19, 2019-20 and 2021-22.

Targeted Intervention Projects (On Sex Workers): - The programme was initiated since 2009, **JanMitram** is engaged in a highly challenging programme for Targeted Intervention of Female Sex Workers, to reduce their risk of HIV-AIDs and STD infection. This project is running through prime support of NACO-National AIDS Control Organization, State Aids Control Society. Technical assistance is being provided by Hindustan Lever Family Planning Trust.

The organization has identified 1200 core groups (FSW +MSM + IDUs) in two towns. Both town have seen high industrialization, mining and thereby emergence of migrant workers and truckers. Overt and covert Sex-workers have increased accordingly, posing great threat of HIV spread in lower middle-income groups. Our primary target is to prevent spreading HIV and sexual transmitted infection among these FSWs through time-to-time awareness and and providing counseling, medicines, condoms etc. we are trying to rehabilitate because many women as possibly belong to other professions too. Table-2 shows RMC, STI and HRG data for MSM&TG, IDU and FSW.

Business Correspondent (BC) NABFIN

NABFIN is an initiative of NABARD born out of serious concerns about the practice of NBFC MFIs in the mid 2000. Entrusted with the responsibility of promoting the microfinance sector besides scaling up SHG-Bank Linkage NABARD thought it fit to form a micro Finance institution on a pilot basis with the objective of developing it as a model NBFC MFI in the country which will facilitate the setting up of benchmarks and standards for the MFI sector. In particular, NABFIN's objective was to ensure that the various maladies found in the sector such as lack of transparency in accounting and disclosure, high transaction cost, lack of diversification in products, increased rates of interest, coercive collection practices, etc. are sought to be eliminated by establishing a fair and transparent Micro Finance Institution. NABFIN provides microfinance and other financial services to the needy and disadvantaged sections of the society for securing their prosperity in rural, semi-urban and urban areas. NABARD, an apex development, a financial institution in our country had pioneered the world's largest microfinance movement called the SHG Bank Linkage program. NABFIN as a subsidiary of NABARD shall evolve into a model microfinance institution to finance SHGs and JLGs and to set standards of governance among the MFIs, operate with exemplary levels of transparency and extend its outreach to the needy, directly or through Business correspondents and Business Facilitators. Janmitram is a BC (Business Correspondent) in NABFIN, who provides micro finance To SHGs and JLGs through NABFIN in Sarangarh, Gharghoda, Kharsia, Pussore and Lailunga block.

Brief summary of the project

Self-Help Group (SHG) is a small voluntary association of poor people, preferably from the same socio-economic background. They come together for solving their common problems through self-help and mutual help. The SHG promotes small savings among its members. The savings are kept with a bank. This common fund is in the name of the SHG. SHG is a group formed by the community, which has specific number of members like 15 or 20. This programme is specially designed for the Self Help Groups those are the backbone of rural development now a days. SHPI makes them economically, socially and psychologically strong. NABARD express an interest to nurture 500 SHG with the help of our organization.

In initial stage itself, we were able to form 490 SHGs in Dharamjaigarh and Chhal cluster of Dharmjaigarh block in Raigarh district. Our organization provides these SHGs bank linkage to avail the loans when needed for different purpose.

1. Janmitram SPS Memorial School, Gharghoda

The school JSPS is running under the guidance of Janmitram Kalyan Samiti in Gharghoda block of Raigarh district presently it has 436 students in the school. Out of these 80 are the residential scholars who are residing in the premises as a hosteller.

The school has adapted 12 poor children to continue their education at free of cost. Those free scholars are getting education apart from RTE under government scheme. We are thankful to the people of Gharghoda who overwhelmingly responded to school and also to Give India Foundation which collected sizable support through its website to open the school. Give India also provide the donation to JanMitram for school fees of poor, tribal and unprivileged children. We are committed to provide them high quality education.

In the year 2018-19 the school has got the affiliation from CBSE which is the only school in Gharghoda, in the development path the school has raised income from the collection and loan. A new hostel special for girls and canteen has started in the same premises. The school is committed to take 120 students as boarding in the JSPS school.

2. SHG Leadership Programme

Janmitram conducted 6 one day leadership training programmes for group leaders and members of Self Help Groups (SHGs) in 4 blocks. The SHG group leader and members were trained in concept and objective of SHGs, importance of regular record keeping, advantage of internal lending, book keeping, income generating activities, financial services for members of SHGs and micro insurance etc.

The core objective of the training to the group leaders was better understanding of important features and functions of SHG, including record keeping, accounting, conduct of regular meetings, group dynamics and assist the SHGs for improvement and sustainable livelihood of their members.

3. Third party Toilet audit (NTPC Lara):-

Janmitram got the task of survey of 265 toilets constructed by NTPC Lara in three blocks of the Raigarh district under Swachh Bharat Abhiyan. The survey work was completed by in April 2021 and the report was submitted. Details are given below:

The study areas for audit of toilets are Kharsia, Sarangarh and Gharghoda blocks of Raigarh district. There are 334 toilets (321 conventional and 13 prefab) constructed in 106, 44 and 94 schools of Kharsia, Sarangarh and Gharghoda, respectively. These toilets are located in different villages. Table shows the complete list of toilets in study areas.

4. Nand Ghar Project by Anil Agrawal Foundation of Vedanta Group

Introduction and Background:

Vide the reference No. VF/NG/O&M/CH/Janmitram/400NG/2021-22 dated 27th August 2021; the MOU was signed between **Vedanta Foundation Mumbai** and **Janmitram Kalyan Samiti, Raigarh** for the operation and maintenance of Nand Ghars in the districts Balod, Bemetara, Durg, Kabirdham, Korba and Raipur. The programme is based on four important verticals i.e. Education, Health, Nutrition and Community Engagement. There is a sub-vertical known as community convergence which is more or less covered in Community Engagement These verticals are successfully implemented with daily monitoring by cluster coordinators since the inception of the programme. Though, there are 400 Nand Ghars are sanctioned but currently 262 are operational (In the month of April an additional 28 new Nand Ghars in Raipur was handed over to us). The details of existing Nand Ghars and staff deployed are given in the table below:

During the third wave of COVID and non-availability of funds this project could not be carried forward to the next work phase.

Success Stories

Sukhlal Rathia is a traditional farmer of village Tendumudi, Kharsia. He lives with his wife Khirmati and lone daughter Chuleshwari who studies in Govt. Middle School. Since, childhood Sukhlal has witnessed poverty and had very limited sources for fundamental living. He had only 0.5 acre of farm land where he used to crop one seasoned paddy of short duration (60-65 day) which yields averagely upto 07-08 quintals per season. He only depends on rainfall for irrigation and has no alternate source of water and regular protection. Apart from lacking of fundamental needs he hasn't been seen in any new clothes or other facilities that other person might have. He stimulated others from his life style of being simple.

In the year 2020-21 there was a training programme in that area for implementation of watershed development prior to the selection of beneficiaries. Looking forward to the condition of Sukhlal and realizing its irregular production and less amount of growth, our team members met Sukhlal and **helped him in creation of farm bund.** After multiple tries and consistent efforts we have developed a farm bund to his farm (which is now 0.65 acre) due to which he has rotated his paddy crop verity to longer duration of hybrid (100-105 days) **due to which his yield has increased up to 14-16 quintals.**

The construction of farm bunds ensures the holding of water for longer duration and his problems also sorted in some manner. He



gifted a new saree to his wife Khirmati after so many years and also provided some quality books to his daughter to add cushion in her studies. He all smiles now and we are also happy to see him smile.

Aatma Ram Rathia, aged 80 is an inspiration for many. He lives in small mud house in village Tendumudi of Kharsia with his wife Kalamati. He served all his due duties to his children and they are living happily somewhere else from the native place. Aatam Ram is sincere, devoted and hard working. He knows the value of hard earned money therefore infect being alone and old age he still works. Poverty, less amount of resources has not let him down and he completed all his due diligence. He had a farm pond of size 15x15x01 mt and had 03 acre of farm land where he used to crop in rabi season only, he also crop groundnut in entire area for soil rotation for more production. As far as the production is concerned it depends upon the rainfall and other scenarios.



During the net planning and implementation discussion in 2018-19, it was found that area of Aatmaram is quite suitable for **farm pond creation**. **The new farm pond ensured the regular water supply during the deficiency of water particularly in summer**. This has not only helped Aatma Ram but also the neighboring farmers. The persistent problem of no irrigation or less irrigation is now sorted. He and his wife Kalamati spend so many times together with no more worrisome due to this asset in their farm

Now, he along with **other farmers are blessed with irrigation facility in both seasons i.e. khariff and rabi**. Aatamram has encouraged many farmers like him to think positively even though the circumstances are substantial difficult.

संचालक, वेदांता फाउंडेशन की रिफ़तशमीम खान ने बताया कि इन नंद घरों पर विशेष ध्यान देते हुए जिला प्रशासन एवं महिला बाल विकास मंत्रालय के निर्देश अनुसार इनमें लगातार सुधार और विकास के काम सुनिश्चित किये जाते हैं ताकि बच्चों की मानसिक और शारीरिक वृद्धि में कोई रुकावट न हो।
